Mother 's Message - "Hannah, you can have a drink after you've tidied your room " Message understood by Hannah - "I'm having a drink and then tidying my room" In English, what we say first is usually what we want the person to do first Hannah becomes upset when she is expected to tidy her room and has not yet had her drink

## Helping someone with communication problems

When we communicate, our brain has to complete a series of tasks So when someone asks you a question, your brain has to understand what you are being asked, decide on your answer and put the words together, before you can give them a reply Different parts of our brain are responsible for each of these tasks If one of these parts is damaged by a stroke, it can cause problems with speaking or

If none of the students guess how to answer, encourage them to ask you the questions and guess what “have to” means from your answers The students then ask and answer similar questions, in pairs or around the class Using the target in context Make statements that include the target language, and encourage the students to guess what you mean
